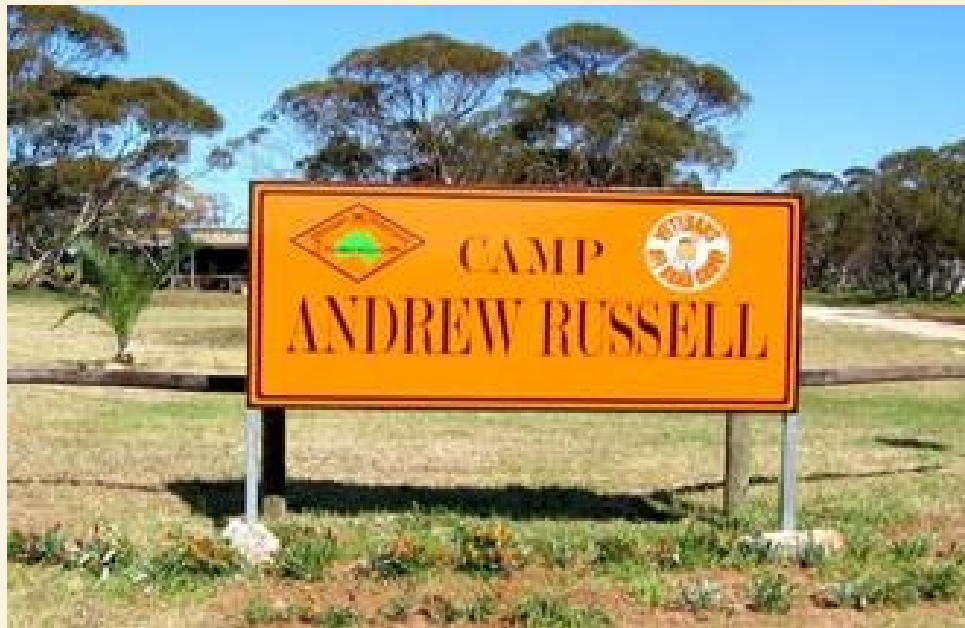


This camp was built by Veterans for Veterans in honour of Sgt Andrew Russell the first Aussie to make the Supreme Sacrifice in Afghanistan.

Do you have a Caravan/Tent/swag and you want to spend a few days away from the Crowded/Noisy, City/Suburb for the Peace and Quiet of the Australian Country/Bush. Well Camp Andrew Russell is for you.

What do you need to do to get there?

First: Contact the Office Manager at VVFSa HQ ring 82962411 or Email vvfsa@tpg.com.au, or contact Bob Haslett on 0429166186 who will advise you of the rules and regulations and what is required. You will be advised of the combination for the camp key. There is a nominal cost of \$5.00 per head per day.

How do we get there?

There are two routes to get to Camp Andrew Russell from Adelaide. ***GPS co-ords 33 44' 40.1"S 140 30' 11.5"E***

Take your best route to Allawoona Then turn alongside the town hall onto the Billiat Rd (road to Lameroo) and travel 1.1 klm look for the white tractor tyre (on your right) with C.A.R. painted on it.

If you live South of the City your best route might be through Murray Bridge, then take the B55 to Karoonda then Allawoona. Then turn right at the town hall onto Billiat Rd(road to Lameroo) and travel 1.1 klm look for the white tractor tire (on your right) with C.A.R painted on it.

Will we need to be self-sufficient (YES to a certain point), the nearest shops are more than 34 Klms away in Loxton.

There is a set of instructions in the retreat kitchen as to what you need to turn on in relation to the camp operations ; water pumps etc. There is no power for caravans however there is a 8 kva generator that supplies power to the kitchen and camp amenities. The camp has a fully fitted out kitchen. All you need is your food and beverage. Water to the kitchen is filtered rain water. There is an onsite caravan with two single and One double bed with linen supplied. The ablution block has two showers, two toilets and two hand basins. All water on the block is supplied from a gravitation tank. Hot water for the showers is supplied by a fire under the donkey heater, too much fire = boiling water so take it easy.
